Non-Fiction: prose writing that is based on facts, real events, and real people, such as biography or history. Ex: Abraham Lincoln's life story

Theme: the subject of a talk, a piece of writing, a person's thoughts, or an

exhibition; a topic.


Synonyms: Subject, topic, message

Genre: a category of artistic composition, as in music or literature, characterized by similarities in form, style, or subject matter.

Ex: Country, rap, and rock are all genres of music.

Horror, comedy, and romance are all novel genres.

Inference: a conclusion reached on the basis of evidence and reasoning.



Persuasive: being good at talking someone into doing or believing something through reasoning or the use of temptation.
